

The Apprenticeship Levy

Non-Levy paying Employers

Employers operating in the UK with an annual pay bill of less than £3million per year will not pay the apprenticeship levy.

- If you are an employer with 50 employees or more, you will make a 5% contribution to the cost of training your apprentice(s) and the government will pay the rest (95%). * If your apprentice is aged 16-18, you will receive £1,000 to help meet the extra costs associated with this.
- If you are an employer with 49 or fewer employees, you will pay the 5% contribution if your learner is 19+. If your learner is aged 16-18, they will be fully funded by the Government. If your apprentice is aged 16-18, you will also receive £1,000 to help meet the extra costs associated with this.

For example:

If the training cost was £4,000

Government pays £3,800

Employer pays £200
